After planting, join us at the Beach House for a potluck picnic. Doors will open at 10:30 am. The Opal lake Beach House is located just south of the corner of the Opal Lake Road and Michaywe Drive intersection.

Spring Plant Exchange

Scheduled for Saturday, June 16, 2012, from 9 a.m. until Noon at the Farmer's Pavilion, this exchange gives members a chance to rejuvenate their own gardens and share their knowledge and plants with other members and the public.

Labeling the plants is important. Members have come up with a variety of ways to do this: From using waterproof markers on the pots or plastic bags, to making plant labels from popsicle sticks, index cards or mini blinds! Label information should include the name of the plant and the light requirements such as sun, shade, or partial shade. Indoor plants are welcomed as well as annuals, seeds, tubers, bulbs, and slightly used garden tools, and ornaments.

Preparing our Gardens for Spring planting

Although our official planting day isn't until June, preparing the gardens for planting is important. Consider the following tips:

- Remove all dead plants, leaves and stems. Burn any diseased material far away from the garden or discard in garbage bags. Do NOT put in your city's compost.
- Lightly loosen the soil and work in some fresh compost mixed with mulch when putting around the base of perennials. This will promote growth and health as well as discourage insects and help plants stay moist longer.
- Buy healthy plants and keep them moist and in the shade until read to plant.

Saturday, June 16-

 Put corn gluten down to prevent weeds from taking over. This will kill unwanted seeds from sprouting.
