A story will be told as to how the "Sturgeon Moon" got it's name along with a viewing through a telescope of the moon. Next month's meeting will be at the Energy Outlet Gazebo (weather permitting). Caryl Irrer will give a demonstration on making cork markers, and other members will be bringing their Crafts for our "Art in the Park" day. (Viewing Crafts only)

Corresponding Secretary: Caryl Irrer read off the names of those members with July birthdays and the birthday song was sung to them. Caryl also mentioned that all the Publicity was out for the Garden Walk and she read a list of all the places announcements were placed.

Plant Exchange: Ann Kureth reported that all went well, but commented that there was hardly any garden art donated as promised. Also, since the last hour was very slow, it was recommended and decided upon that the Exchange would be one hour shorter. The total made was \$92.00 which was very good. The weather was perfect and the tent is definitely needed to draw attention to the Exchange. The leftover plants were given to the Habitant for Humanity Committee to use at this year's house. After they used what they needed, the rest of the plants were given to Parks and Rec Department. A big thank-you was given to the Plant Exchange Committee for a job well done.

View my Garden: Janet Woityra will be having the next View my Garden at her home on Wed. August 7th. Janet gave a description of some of the gardens she and her husband tend at their home. She invited all to come. We are to bring a folding chair and a bag lunch. Directions to her house in Michaywe were sent out to the Members.

Garden Walk: Tammy Fairchild gave a reminder of the Pre-Walk on Monday (July 15th) starting at the Bourdage Home on Manuka Lake. We are to bring our Flower signs. Other reminders (for the actual Walk) – wear flowered hat or blumenkratz and dress summer garden appropriate; check your working hours; ticket money due in today; Tammy also announced that there will be a drawing (at the Energy Outlet only) on two "shoe" moss gardens at a dollar a ticket. Kathleen Norman was happy to announce that all Greeter time slots were filled and Denise said the same about the artists. Marge said she might be asking for help with the Energy Outlet Gardens the Sunday before the Walk.

Library Display: Will occur in September.

New Business: Joan C. read a letter from Marilyn McIntosh suggesting that we might consider handing out awards around town for outstanding gardens followed up with a postcard showing our appreciation for their hard work in beautifying our community. Joan wanted pros and cons from the members about this idea. A discussion followed and the comments (which were mostly against taking on another project at this time) will be taken back to the Board Members to be decided upon. One of the ideas, of just sending a postcard to places with nice gardens (like homes, businesses, non-profit organizations) from the Garden Club thanking them for their help in making our community a nicer place to live, was liked by almost all the members.
