SUMMARY OF CAREER ACHIEVEMENTS

Prof Mary Sheehan, the Founding Director of CARRS-Q, comes from a distinguished academic and scientific career focusing on identifying, assessing and initiating innovative priority-driven research programs leading to the development and implementation of strategies and policies to improve safety on our roads, in our workplaces and in our communities. This was her vision for the Centre which, under her leadership, has become one of the principal centres in Australia dedicated to decreasing the local, national and international burden of trauma-related harm, with strong networks in the road safety and injury prevention fields. CARRS-Q currently has over 75 dedicated staff consisting of 4 Professors; 13 academic researchers, including 9 Postdoctoral fellows; 21 research staff; 10 support staff; and 33 postgraduate research students.

She has been awarded more than \$4.5M in competitive research funding including a major program of study funded by a "whole of government" consortium to reduce the economic, medical and social costs of road crashes in rural and remote northern Queensland. She has published over 100 papers and has taken the leadership on the development, implementation and evaluation of 4 major injury prevention programs. She has chaired and been an invited member on a wide range of public health and road safety committees at the international, national and state level.
