

DURFEE & LAMBERT, Ten Cent Feed Barn

The "Ten Cent Feed Barn" operated by Geo. Durfee and Thos. Lambert just west of the M. C. R. R. tracks is one of the best conducted liveries in the section of the state, everything up-to-date in vehicles of all kinds being kept. The building was erected in 1901 by Arthur Comstock, he running the business alone for some time. Geo. Durfee was taken in as a partner and the business was conducted by Comstock & Durfee until last fall when Mr. Comstock sold his interest in the business to Thos. Lambert.

Today the boys have one of the best equipped liveries and feed stables in this part of the country. Their barn is open at all hours of the day or night and orders by phone (No. 33), mail ore telegraph receive prompt and careful attention. They make a special feature catering to traveling men, furnishing them experienced and careful drivers to all parts of the surrounding country at most reasonable rates.
