#### **GLEN'S MARKET**

Recently Glen's Market redecorated the interior of their Gaylord store. When they decided to include historical pictures they approached us for copies of pictures taken in the early 1900's. Many of these pictures are now hanging in large frames throughout the store. They generously donated \$200.00 to the OCHS to thank us for the help we provided with this project.

Glen's Market has been a tradition in Gaylord since 1951. C. Glen Catt opened his store on Main Street in what had been Vincent's Market. This building was located on what is now the parking lot between the Brother Coffee business and the VFW hall.. By 1954 a new building was built next door on the corner of Indiana and Main St.



Then, in 1967, Glen's Market built it's present store on a empty field by I-75. We know this as the Alpine Plaza. Continual growth of business allowed Glen's Market to expand in 1983, turning the store into 45,000 square feet supermarket.

The generosity of the Catt family to the community has been widely felt. One popular program was the Glen's Save-Share program. This allowed non profit organizations to redeem grocery slips for 1 percent of qualified purchases. Many events and schools benefited from this program. They also supported numerous community efforts through direct donations and discounts. One could always count on them to help with worthy community causes.

At this time Glen's Markets are owned by Spartan Stores. However, part of the Catt family is still involved in the local grocery business through the Save-A-Lot store in Gaylord.

#### **The Yuill Family**

One of the names almost synonymous with the lumbering days of yore in Otsego County is Yuill. The firm of the Yuill Brothers of Vanderbilt consisted of the brothers, John and Thomas. From the last 1800's to the late 1930's they operated a flourishing lumbering business.

They immigrated from Scotland by way of Ontario, Canada. They set up a home on 160 acres of dense hardwood forest just west of Vanderbilt. They were later joined by two younger brothers, James and Samuel at their log cabin. James soon settled on land east of Vanderbilt and Samuel worked in his brothers' wood business.

When the railroad line was extended from Gaylord to Vanderbilt the brothers worked clearing and grading the right-of-way. They also worked in lumber camps and later started contracting for logs. This marked the beginning of their prosperous lumbering business.

By 1900 the brothers were operating a number of logging camps. The timber was shipped to mills at Bay City and Saginaw and fuel wood was shipped to Detroit. In 1905 the Yuill firm purchased the saw mill and logging railroad of the Rogers-Allison Lumber Company south of Vanderbilt along with their timber holdings. This area was called Logan. It grew to include a post office, stores, one room school and potato warehouse. It is now a ghost town and there is little evidence left of its former life.

By 1910 the firm was producing around 20 million board feet annually. In addition to their logging operations



large quantities of railroad ties, line poles, posts and pulpwood, and hemlock bark, used in the tanning process, was shipped.

They bought the John Berry general merchandise store in Vanderbilt in 1916 and operated it until 1940. They also went into the farming and livestock business.

The next generations of the Yuill family included many professionals, businessmen, and community leaders. Among them was J. Richard, plant manager of Higgins in Vanderbilt, who was known to many in the county as a county commissioner and county chairman of the Board of Commissioners. When the Alpine Center was re-opened as a governmental center it was dedicated to J. Richard Yuill in recognition of his many years of service to the community.
