FIESTA SWEET POTATO SOUP

1 pkg. fully cooked Kielbasa links, chopped

1 can yams, cut into smaller pieces

1 large onion chopped

1 small green pepper, chopped

2 tbsp olive oil

2 tsp ground cumin

2 cans chicken broth (15 oz)

1 can diced tomatoes with mild chilies (15 oz)

1 can black beans rinsed and drained (15oz)

2 tbsp minced fresh cilantro (optional)

In a large saucepan sauté the sausage, onion and pepper in oil until onion is tender. Add cumin: cook 1 minute longer. Stir in broth, yams, tomatoes, and beans. Bring to a boil and stir. Reduce hear; cover and simmer for 10 minutes and them add the cilantro if desired. Garnish servings with sour cream and green onions (optional). Yield 6 servings.


New members have joined the board. They are Brian Pearson, Margaret Albert, and Leo Sensabaugh. We are looking forward to working together with them.
