### Architectural Description:

#### Vernacular Tudor-

The gable front and wing roof style was very popular during the Tudor Era (1890-1940).

The Front façade is dominated by two prominent, steeply pitched cross gables. The home has primarily tall, narrow windows which were also common during the era, although primarily seen in groups. The front gable is detailed with verge-board, the massive chimney is placed at a prominent location, and the entry is given particular significance. The home also features a stone-clad side porch typical of the Tudor Era.
