### Architectural Description:

Vernacular Queen Anne (1880-1910):

This home has many Queen Anne identifying features, most of which are still intact today. The home is a nice version of a simplified Queen Anne. It is interesting to note the Lester C. Scott home, sister home to this, is also a Queen Anne, although more elaborate. The Lester C. Scott home is also located on East Main.
